

EYFS Book Suggestions

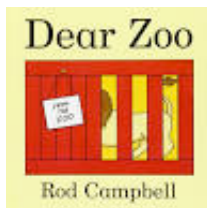
A selection of books to share and enjoy with your child at home.



EACH PEACH PEAR PLUM by Allan Ahlberg, Janet Ahlberg Each beautifully illustrated page encourages young children to interact with the picture to find the next fairy tale and nursery rhyme character. In this book with your little eye, take a look, and play 'I spy'.



GORILLA by Anthony Browne Hannah loves gorillas but has never seen one. Her father's too busy to take her to the zoo - or for anything else come to that. For her birthday, Hannah asks her father for a gorilla - but is disappointed when she discovers that the gorilla she's got is just a toy one. But then something extraordinary happens...



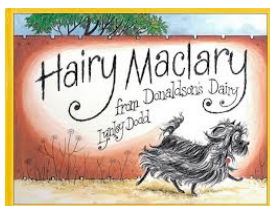
DEAR ZOO by Rod Campbell I wrote to the zoo to send me a pet ...This classic lift-the-flap book is perfect for little hands.

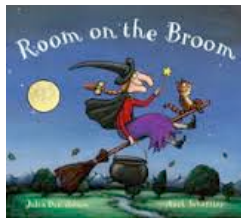

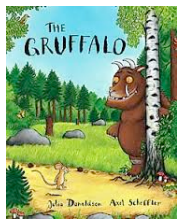

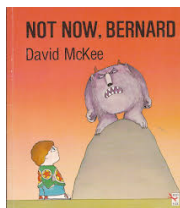
gang get involved in lots of adventures.
